TWO PEDESTRIANS STRUCK IN FAIL TO REMAIN COLLISION IN WASHAGO

(SEVERN TOWNSHIP, ON) – The Orillia OPP Detachment is seeking the public's assistance to help solve a fail to remain collision in Washago, Severn Township.

On Sunday, July 4, 2010, at approximately 5:40 p.m. two men were walking on Bond Road in Severn Township when they were struck by a vehicle which failed to remain and left the scene. The two pedestrians, a 59 year old male and a 24 year old male both from Severn Twp. were transported by ambulance to Orillia Soldiers' Memorial Hospital with non-life threatening injuries.

The OPP is looking for an early 1990's blue Ford Mustang. This vehicle had stickers in the back window and a silver patch possibly primer on the driver's side front quarter panel between the driver's door and the front left tire.

This Ford Mustang appeared to have been traveling with a second vehicle, a grey 1996 Ford Ranger extended cab pick-up truck. The truck has a pinstripe across the tail gate and a dent in the centre of the front black bumper.

The vehicles were last seen traveling north bound on Muskoka Rd in Washago. Both drivers of the vehicles are described as male, white in their 20's both with short dark hair.
