POLICE REQUEST ASSISTANCE OF THE PUBLIC IN LOCATING MISSING HEART MONITOR

(ORO-MEDONTE TOWNSHIP, ON.) – On Wednesday June, 2, 2010, the Barrie Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) was notified with regards to a heart monitor that was reported as missing.

Police have learned that the monitor, which is described as gray in colour and approximately the size of a cellular phone, has four (4) round metallic connectors on it and is contained in black coloured pouch was likely lost on or about Friday May 28, 2010.

It is not known where exactly the monitor was lost, but the owner resides in the area of Line 11 North, Oro-Medonte Township and travels by bus to Park Street Collegiate in Orillia.

The school and bus company have been alerted and police are requesting that anyone who resides in the area of Line 11 North, north of Horseshoe Valley Road to please keep an eye open for a black coloured pouch that contains this heart monitor which is valued at approximately \$3000.00.
