OPP RECOVER STOLEN FIREARMS

(ORILLIA, ON) – On Thursday May 20th 2011, the Orillia Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) recovered firearms which had been stolen from a break in earlier this month.

The break and enter occurred at a residence on Highway 12 in Ramara Township on May 13th, 2011. As a result of the combined effort from the York Regional Police Service, the OPP Central North Drug Enforcement Unit, the OPP Rural Agriculture Crime Team (RACT) and members of the Orillia Crime Unit and detachment members, all stolen firearms have now been recovered.

The 22 calibre rifle was recovered by police on May 15th, 2011 after police investigated a report of shots being fired at a residence. Two long guns were still outstanding. This incident is still under investigation.

On May 20th, 2011, police executed a search warrant at a residence in the Town of Georgina. As a result, the remaining 2 long guns were recovered and a male was arrested and charged.

Aaron Paul NOTTINGHAM, 24 years old of Lakeshore Road, Town of Georgina was arrested and held for a bail hearing, Friday May 20th.

Charges include:

Unauthorized Possession of Firearm, Possession of Prohibited or Restricted Firearm/Ammunition, Careless Storage of a Firearm, Possession of Weapon obtained by Crime, and Possession of Schedule II Cannabis.
