OVERNIGHT PARKING BAN BEGINS *Update*

(ORILLIA, ON) – The Orillia detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) want to remind the public of the ban on parking in Municipal Lots and on city streets which went into effect today. The Municipal By-law restriction is set out in Section 11(1) of the City of Orillia Traffic/Parking By-law 2007-55 which states;

“No person shall park a vehicle on a highway or municipal parking lot at any time between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. of any day from November 15th of one year to April 15th of the following year.”

Starting today, November 15th, 2011, Orillia OPP will be enforcing the parking by-law. Vehicles which are towed are done so at the owner's expense. The ban is in effect until April 15th, 2012.

The prohibition is in effect whether it is snowing or not. There is a zero tolerance, all vehicles will be ticketed and/or towed.

The set fine for the parking offence is \$50.00 with the option for early payment of \$30.00.

The cost of towing is determined by each tow company.
