Orillia Detachment responded to 4813 calls for service during the first quarter of 2009 of which 3338 calls were within the City of Orillia.

This page shows a breakdown of Criminal calls for service within the City of Orillia during the first quarter of 2009 including clearance rates.

It is great to see a reduction in overall crime for this quarter when compared to the same period in 2008 with an overall reduction of 82 crimes within the City of Orillia. That means 82 less victims in our City.

It is also great to see an improvement in the detachment clearance rate from 31.4 % in 2008 to 52.7% in 2009. a 21% improvement is significant and represents extreme dedication and hard work by the members of this detachment for their community.

I'm very proud of our officers for this outstanding effort.

Cases of Interest

Driver charged after failing to stop for Police

During the evening of January 4th, 2009, the Orillia detachment attempted to stop and impaired driver which resulted in a pursuit. The driver refused to stop and a spike belt was deployed. The spike belt was effective, and though the driver continue to attempt to flee his vehicle was disable and after a short distance the driver was arrested and charged. No injuries were sustained.

School Lock Down

On the Seventh of January 2009 at approximately 1:30pm the Orillia OPP initiated a lock-down of a local high school as a gun had been reported on the school grounds. A thorough search of the school and school occupants was conducted by Orillia Officers, the OPP Emergency Response Unit, and Canine Units. No weapons were located in the school and it was deemed to be safe. The students were released from the school at 2:30pm. The school was in lock-down for approximately one hour. One male party was arrested in connection with the case.

Fatal Fire

Police were involved in a fatal fire on January 19, 2009 at Muskoka Heights Retirement Residence, located at 327 Old Muskoka Road in Orillia. Two residents died in this fire, and two more have since died. The Fire Chief indicated that police officers played a vital role in saving the lives of other residents. Officers involved will be recognized through the OPP recognition and awards system. This case remains under investigation by the Ontario Fire Marshalls office.

Convenience Store Robbery

On Wednesday, 11th of March 2009 at 9:27p.m., a lone male entered a convenience store on Colborne Street in Orillia. The male walked up to the clerk and demanded cash. The male was given a small quantity of cash and left the store. No weapon was seen or displayed.

Follow up investigation enabled Orillia crime Unit to identify a suspect, who was later arrested and charged for Robbery, and other unrelated offences.

Convenience Store Robbery

On the 29th of March 2009, at approximately 11:00 p.m. Orillia OPP Constable Shannon LaMarche observed a suspicious male leaving a convenience store located on Atherley Rd. The male entered a waiting car which drove away. Constable Lamarche was in the process of stopping the car when he was advised that an armed robbery had just occurred at the convenience store. Lamarche and assisting units arrested three suspects for the armed robbery and recovered the victim's stolen property.
